SUMMER MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

A few home maintenance tasks to tackle during the summer months:

-Reverse ceiling fan direction to counterclockwise to maximize air being pushed directly down.

-Service your AC to ensure you aren't left in the heat this summer, and replace your HVAC filter to keep dust and allergens at bay.

-Consider having your chimney cleaned when these companies are less busy.

-Replace rotted deck boards and check to see if it needs to be resealed by pouring water onto the boards. If the water is absorbed rather than beading up, it is time to reseal your deck.

-Clean and repair gutters and downspouts.

-Inspect caulking around doors and windows to keep unwanted pests out.

-Repair driveway & sidewalk cracks.
